

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

1. Policy & Rules grants authority to each State at its sole discretion to define Prohibited Activities, which are binding on all members of that State.
2. It is most important for Leaders to realise that the Association's Insurers will not cover members who engage in these activities.
3. The following activities are declared prohibited activities:
 - "Fire Ball Hockey", "Flaming Football", and similar activities involving the use of "fire balls" are defined as prohibited activities and must not be played by *Scouts* in NSW.
 - Hang Gliding, Parachuting, Parasailing, and Parascending are not recognised in NSW as normal Scouting activities and participation in these activities is restricted to the conditions as outlined in "Commercially Run Activities".
4. Association members must not be involved in the management or conduct of the foregoing activities unless prior approval is granted by the Chief Commissioner.
