The Units of Competency which are used by Scouts Australia to ensure that our standards in adventurous activities align to community standards are taken from the Certificate II, III and IV in Outdoor Recreation.

Typical Scouting pathway

Any member of Scouts Australia who has sufficient evidence can apply for Recognition of Prior Learning. Experiences and learning received by Venturers, Rovers and adult members across Australia, align to the Units of Competency in the Outdoor Recreation Qualifications. A typical pathway that enables collection of valid evidence is:

- Complete the Adventurous Activities e-Learning modules, http://training.scouts.com.au/curriculums/adventurousactivities
- Complete the relevant Practical course,
- Maintain a logbook as you participate in events and trips using your new adventurous activities skills,
- A current subject matter expert who holds the Guide level or higher, units of competency completes and signs the Observation Checklist
- Complete the workbook for the relevant activity skill level,
- Contact your Branch Training Administrator and submit all of the above evidence to be assessed by a SAIT Assessor.

Subject Matter Experts:

Most Subject Matter Experts (SME) used within Scouting are a member of Scouts Australia who hold the relevant units of competency and have an up to date logbook demonstrating currency in the relevant adventurous activity. To be considered as an SME and sign the participant's Observation Checklist you must hold the following units of competency along with the relevant adventurous activity units, including either the relevant Guide or Instructor unit of competency.

- SISONAV201A Demonstrate navigation skills in a controlled environment
- PUAOPE002B Operate communications systems and equipment
- SISOOPS202A Use and maintain a temporary or overnight site
- HLTAID003 Provide first aid
- SISOODR302A Plan outdoor recreation activities
- SISOOPS201A Minimise environmental impact
- SISOOPS304A Plan for minimal environmental impact
- SISOOPS306A Interpret weather conditions in the field
- SISOODR303A Guide outdoor recreation sessions
- SISXCAI306A Facilitate groups
- SISXOHS101A Follow occupational health and safety policies
- SISXRSK301A Undertake risk analysis of activities
- SISXEMR201A Respond to emergency situations
- TAEDEL301A Provide work skill instruction
- BSBCMM401A Make a presentation
