ScoutHike is Sydney North Region's premier annual Scout Section event and is celebrating 26 years in 2019. If you are interested in an exciting weekend, lightweight hiking around a NSW State Forest - then this is an event you must register for!

Activity Bases are set up to with twenty-four of the activities based on a component of the Scout Award Scheme. This is a hiking and campcraft event for Scouts. Scout Hike provides an opportunity for Scouts and Patrols to compete for a trophy. Each Scout attending receives a badge – and everyone has a great time.

Leaders are encouraged to get involved

in assisting their Scouts to increase their knowledge of hiking and lightweight camping. Everyone is transported into the area on the Friday night and home again on the Sunday. Camping is in allocated 'Sleep Points' with activity bases spread around the forest. Each Patrol hikes to and participates in as many activities as possible, before reaching their set campsites on the Saturday night, and the HQ closing site on Sunday. 

# SCOUT HERITAGE

## The Australian Scout Museum

The Australian Scout Museum is located at Building 140, Newington Armory, Sydney Olympic Park, and is open every Sunday 10am – 2pm. The Museum features displays on Scouting History, and provides a great range of activities for Groups and visitors to participate in.

Plan a great day out for your section or group and take part in the Escape the Scout Museum activity, Cub history badge worksheets, or just explore the displays. Group Packages are available with Newington Armory Heritage Train Rides or Segway Rides: Joey and Cub Scout package, \$15pp – Scout and Venturer package, \$20pp. General entry by donation.

Parking is available at the northern end of Jamieson Street in Blaxland Riverside Park (100m walk) and at Wilson Park via Newington Road (750m walk). Ferry from the City or Parramatta to Sydney Olympic Park then walk (1.5km) or bike ride to the Museum. Combine your day at the Australian Scout Museum with a bike ride around Newington Armory, playing at the popular Blaxland Riverside Park or a visit to the Birds Australia Discovery Centre. Toilets and picnic facilities are available at Newington Armory.

# AIR ACTIVITY CENTRE

Scouts NSW Air Activity Centre (AAC) is located at Camden Airport. It is a unique operation with a fleet of four modern Cessna 172 Aircraft owned and operated by Scouts NSW with volunteer (Scout Leader) pilots and ground crew. Activities Days are held during all school term weekends and can be booked on-line through the AAC website <http://air.nsw.scouts.com.au/>. For Country and regional Scouting members who can't get to us we take the aircraft to them.

The day commences with a Flag Parade and Safety Briefing after which there is an in-depth visual inspection of aircraft led by the pilots.

Once the course is completed, they take the air for a scenic flight after which there is the chance to earn a badge!

During the day all members and visitors are taken on a supervised aerodrome walk on the airside (active side).

## Additional opportunities

Those considering Venturer or Queen Scout Awards could earn points through the AAC. Venturer and Queen Scout levels would include Pursuits (within Personal Growth section), Outdoor and Expedition (Outdoor Activities) and Service (Community Involvement). There is the opportunity to take a Trial Instructional Flight (TIF) with a fully qualified instructor. For anyone wishing to undertake further training to obtain a private pilot's licence, a commercial pilot's licence or become a flight instructor, there is no better professional or cost effective way than through the AAC and our partner training organisation, Altocap Flight School.

## INTERNATIONAL SCOUTING

Having an International Scouting experience is a great way to explore the world, and also transforms what it means for you to be a Scout as well. It is also possible to have a memorable International Scouting experience right here in Australia – such as hosting or communicating with Scouts overseas.

### Travelling Overseas as a Scout

There are three main ways:

#### 1) **National Contingents**

The most popular way to travel overseas with Scouts is to join a National Contingent. These trips are organised by a central team of volunteers, and you will join Scouts from across Australia as you travel to specific events or milestones across the globe. A list of events and contingents are available via <http://international.scouts.com.au/travel-with-scouting>.

The most important thing is to watch out for the opportunities. There are new trips added, opening and closing regularly. These are promoted widely, however you should plan ahead as registration and payment can occur one or two years in advance. All you need to do is make sure your registration is up to date, and that you sign up according to the process set out by the contingent you wish to join.

National Contingents to Jamborees, Ventures, Moots and other events in countries like New Zealand, Mongolia, Switzerland and Iceland

have been incredibly popular in recent years. Record numbers of Australians are travelling overseas as a Scout – and having the adventure of a lifetime.

#### 2) **NSW-Only Friendship Visit or Service Trip**

Local groups or districts may wish to organise their own boutique trip, and travel for adventure, education or service. These groups can be Scout Groups, Units, Crews, service trips or small group travel. Recent trips have included a district visiting KISC in Switzerland, and a group of Venturers hiking the Milford Sound Track in NZ as part of a QSA Award.

While National Contingents manage all the detail on your behalf, you and your group will be responsible for ensuring your trip is properly planned, well organised, and safe. Start your planning early – the duty of care and organisation is important and can take time to get right.

All trips must be registered with Scouts NSW, to ensure the proper planning, insurance, risk assessments and support have been undertaken. Your State Commissioner – International, Robert Slater, is available to assist you in your planning. Registration is now completely online, which makes the paperwork and payment much easier. Robert can also provide templates to help you build your travel arrangements, itinerary, risk management plan, activity plan, emergency contacts and more.



### 3) Individual Travel

You may wish to incorporate some Scouting into your private travel. While Scouts NSW cannot support you as an individual traveller overseas, or connect you with Scouts overseas, we can provide you with a WOSM-endorsed Letter of Introduction, which confirms you are a member of Scouts Australia. This can prove useful when making connections overseas. Applications can be lodged online with the State Commissioner – International. As with all travel overseas, Scouts should also register their plans with <http://smarttraveller.gov.au/> to receive support, advice and alerts.

Scouts may also join the Scouts International Student Exchange Program (SISEP). This program offers the chance to live and even attend school with local family in another country. It's an incredible way to experience a country as 'a local' – and ranges from a few weeks to a few months long. More information can be found on the International website.

### International Scouting in Australia

There are plenty of options to connect with Scouts across the world, without having to leave Australia. These also tend to be more affordable and suitable for younger age groups:

#### International Communication – PenPals

PenPals is the official way to connect with Scouts from across the world. The program includes email, Skype, Whatsapp and more – you can connect however you like!

To be part of the Pen-Pal Program you must be a registered Scouts Australia member – youth or adult. This will be verified with your relevant state before we link you with an overseas Pen-Pal. Groups can also link with an equivalent Group or Section overseas. Registrations are now open for individual Australian youth members and Leaders, as well as Group links between a Mob, Pack, Troop or Unit and an equivalent Group overseas.

JOTA/JOTI Jamboree On The Air (JOTA) and Jamboree On The Internet (JOTI) is the world's largest annual Scouting event with over 1 million Scouts spread across more than 150 countries participating.

It is a virtual global camp with Scouts simultaneously communicating with other Scouts by means of amateur radio and the internet. JOTA-JOTI enables Scouts around the world to share their experience, establish and build scouting friendships promoting a sense of belonging to the worldwide Scout Movement.

#### SISEP Hosting

The Scouts International Student Exchange Program is reciprocal, meaning Australia often hosts participants from Indonesia, Japan, Denmark and beyond. We are always looking for families to assist, and it is a great way to learn more about another country, culture and language – as well as showing off Australia and Scouting here too.

#### International Themed Program Nights

In the most simple terms, International Scouting can start at Joey-age as part of a programmed night. International Scouting should be a central part of every section, and can encourage some exciting and challenging ideas. Experience the traditional dress and food of another country; visit a famous city using Google Maps and Street View; or even visit a local community group or cultural space to start to explore the world beyond Australia.

#### International Explorer Award

The International Explorer Award is a belt and buckle that can be worn in place of the standard belt buckle on the uniform belt.
