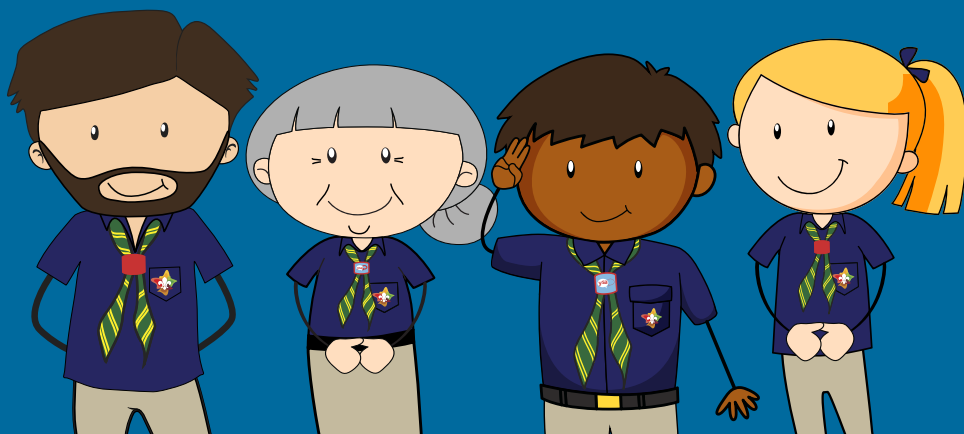

WHEN DO I NEED TO
LOG SOMETHING?

If you witness unsafe behaviour, if you are told about unsafe behaviour, if you feel unsafe, if you must log it.

Everything that breaches the Code of Conduct; all suspicions, concerns or allegations about youth protection matters must be logged.

If in doubt, log it.
