A YSA LIVES

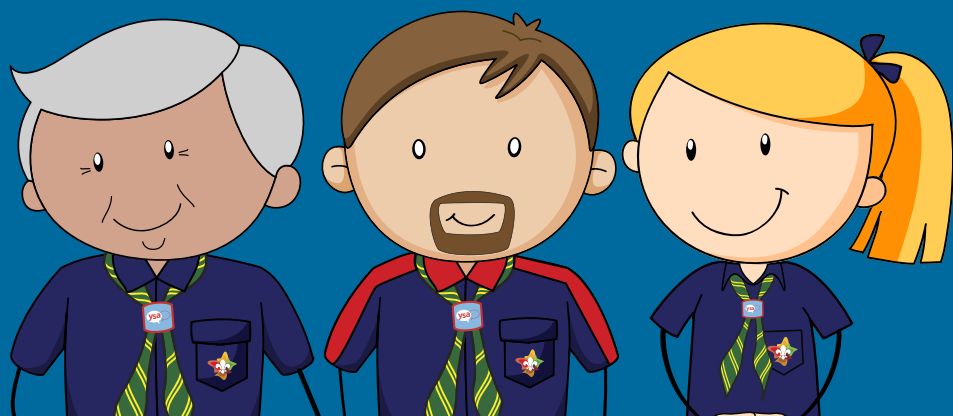
- By the Code of Conduct

WHAT

NEED TO KNOW?

Every YSA must be aware of and familiar with Scouts NSW's Policies and Procedures, which are in place to create a safe and secure environment.

WHEN

WHEN DO I NEED TO
LOG SOMETHING?

If you witness unsafe behaviour, if you are told about unsafe behaviour or if you feel unsafe, you must log it.

Everything that breaches the Code of Conduct; all suspicions, concerns or allegations about youth protection matters must be logged.

If in doubt, log it.
