

## Assistant Chief Commissioners — Responsibilities / Structure

### Program, Youth Safety and Support

#### Assistant Chief Commissioner—Strategy, Culture & Engagement

Responsibility areas include:

- Strategy & Innovation – Driving strategic initiatives and embedding the strategy across the organisation; identifying trends and opportunities and developing innovative ways to correct, adjust or capitalise on them; working closely with the ACC Region Support & Development on ways to remove barriers or derailment factors.
- Stakeholder Engagement - Working collaboratively with the Communications team to modernise the Movement's image; supports the reputational messages of Scouts NSW; works with the Chief Commissioner and DCCs on a positive cultural narrative.
- Partnerships & Advocacy – Identifying and supporting partnership opportunities for Scouts NSW; assisting the Chief Commissioner in the management of government and corporate relationships
- Risk Management – Managing risk and safety of adults, youth and situations.
- Fellowships – Recruiting and retention for Fellowships; supporting Activity Bases and Scouting activities.
- Activity Bases – Management of Activity Bases, including bookings, promotions, maintenance, gaining support by Fellowships.

#### Assistant Chief Commissioner - Adults in Scouting

Responsibility areas include:

- Child Protection & Issues Management – Managing and handling adult issues.
- Adult Training & Development – Adult training, focused on vocational education and training opportunities and Scouts Australia Institute of Training to promote externally recognised qualifications.
- Adventurous Activities – Focused on training adults to be able to facilitate adventurous activities.
- Members Support – Support for members, including Mental Health First Aid team.
- Inclusion – Focused on increasing the diversity and inclusion of Scouts NSW, including Scouts with special or additional needs; fostering partnerships with diverse communities and organisations; providing guidance to members on areas of diversity; organiser of the special events.

#### Assistant Chief Commissioner - Youth Engagement

Responsibility areas include:

- Youth Empowerment - Promoting the voice of youth across Scouting.
- Chairs of Youth Councils – Encouraging involvement of youth members in the future of Scouting in NSW.
- Chair of Branch Rover Council – Encouraging involvement of youth members in the future of Scouting in NSW.



## Assistant Chief Commissioner - Youth Program & Youth Support

Responsibility areas include:

- Program Transformation – Implementing the Youth Program across NSW.
  - Upskilling – Arranging and facilitating upskilling sessions (face-to-face and online).
  - Implementation Assurance – Embedding the Youth Program into Groups.
  - nYP Communications – Managing communications about transformation.
- Youth Program – Overseeing the support of the Youth Programs across the State.
  - Program Support – Providing age-specific support to Regions and Groups/Units.
  - Major Events – Supporting activities as a part of major events.
- Youth Development – Supporting program activities and resources.
  - Outdoor Adventure Skills - Bushwalking and Orienteering, Alpine, Water, Vertical, Cycling & Mountain Bikes, Motorsports, Archery
  - Educational Purpose
  - One Program
  - International
  - Special Interest Areas – Environment, STEM, Arts and Literature, Better World
  - Air Activities – Reporting also to the Chief Commissioner, as required by CASA.

Responsibility areas include:

- Growth & Retention – Working closely with indicators of membership movement to assist with retention; identifying opportunities, especially within growth corridors, for membership growth; assisting Region Commissioners on challenges and opportunities; working with Region Development Officers to create and respond to interest in Regions.
