Reminder: Applications for Community Building Partnership Grants close in two weeks

Dear Group Leaders/Leaders in Charge, District Commissioners and Region Commissioners

This is a gentle reminder that **applications for the 2021 Community Building Partnership Grants program close in just over two weeks' time, on Friday 14 May.**

The Community Building Partnership Grants program is a very important opportunity for Groups and Formations to undertake much-needed repairs to Scout properties. In past years, the program has enabled Groups and Formations to complete kitchen renovations, bathroom repairs, disability access installation, roof replacements, flooring replacements, fencing repairs, and much more.

With a great turn out to our informational webinar series last Tuesday and Wednesday evenings, I have no doubt many of you are already well on your way to completing your applications.

Competition is fierce for the Community Building Partnership Grants, so please ensure you utilise the coming days to have all the documentation ready for your application.

There are a few important things to remember:

- Including quotations is a great way to strengthen your application, so use this time to obtain quotations for the work you would like to be completed as part of your project.
- If your project requires a DA, you will need to provide evidence that this has begun or has been approved. There are strict time frames for any project where a DA is required.
- Take some time to engage with your local State MP.
